When someone ask me what my favorite color is I usually respond "color". I love color, all colors and depending upon the day my "favorite" may differ.

For example I was looking out a window of the office at a forsythia bush that is growing by the side of the garage. The yellow of the newly bloomed flowers against that white background was so bright and beautiful that at that moment yellow was my favorite color. Yet I am reminded of the gorgeous red bird that was walking around on top of the snow in my back yard this winter and at that moment red was my favorite color. Or how could my favorite color not be the beautiful blue coloring in my sister's eyes, or the green grasses that I saw as I flew over farmland, or the strawberry blond of my granddaughter's hair? Do you see my dilemma in naming a favorite color?

All of the colors are created by God just as we as individuals are created by God. We are reminded that we are all created in God's image but we are created with different talents. I try very hard to look at our differences as blessings. However I do know that some may choose their favorite people because of those differences. That word favorite can and does get us in trouble. In the book of James chapter 2 we learn about favoritism and how wrong it can be.

Here are eight reasons from my study bible that helps explain why showing favoritism among people is wrong:

1. It is inconsistent with Christ's teachings.
2. It results from evil thoughts.
3. It insults people made in God's image.
4. It is a by-product of selfish motives.
5. It goes against the biblical definition of love.
6. It shows a lack of mercy to those less fortunate.
7. It is hypocritical.
8. It is sin.

Wow, I know that after I read and studied this chapter a little closer my use of the word favorite certainly changed. Like all the beautiful colors created by God, all people are created by God. In God's wonderful plan we all have a purpose. Even though those purposes may be different, it is my belief that they are all important and that God doesn't have a favorite purpose, no more than I can name a favorite color.

If you don't know what your purpose is I would like to suggest that you find out by sitting down with God and having some talks with Him, not to become His favorite, but to fulfill your purpose in the Master's plan. Jesus loved us enough to suffer and die for our sins so that we can join Him in His favorite place, Heaven.

STEPHEN MINISTRY REFLECTIONS

Distinctively Christian Caring



While I was thinking about what to write for this month's article, I opened the 2011 Daily Bible Reading Guide. The reading for March 5 was 2 Corinthians 1: 1-11. Verses 3-7 continues what I wrote last month – reaching out to others in our congregation. Paul is writing from prison in these verses.

“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all consolation who consoles us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to console those who are in any affliction with the consolation with which we ourselves are consoled by God. For just as the sufferings of Christ are abundant for us, so also our consolation is abundant through Christ. If we are being afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation; if we are being consoled, it is for your consolation which you experience when you patiently endure the same sufferings that we are also suffering. Our hope for you is unshaken, for we

know that as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our consolation.”

As we continue through Lent we ponder on the sufferings of Christ and his death on the cross for our salvation. Even as he hung on the cross his thoughts were of others. Through Christ, we can also help others who may be suffering. Have you taken the challenge I made last month? If not, how do you start?

Pick up the phone and ask,

“How are you?”

“How can I pray for you?”

“What would you like me to pray for you?”

Listen and reflect back what you hear the person say. Share a Bible story or devotional. Encourage by giving support and affirmation. Trust that God will be with you in any act of Distinctively Christian Care if you ask for his presence and guidance.

With a fortified root system, a deeper, meaningful relationship with the Lord, those challenging winds can be withstood without as much “damage,” and making us stronger in our faith and impact for Christ in the world.

The Grow Time Advisory Board has been working hard to provide a diverse offering of classes for the 2nd quarter of 2011. Grow Time offers classes that vary in length and keeps learning opportunities consistently available to both “veterans” and “rookies” alike. Remember that ***The Open Door*** class is the perfect place to see what Grow Time is all about. With its welcoming atmosphere and stand alone lessons each week (not part of a series or ongoing book study), The Open Door extends hospitality to those visiting Trinity, those wanting to try out a Grow Time experience, folks who are not in another Grow Time class, and teachers between teaching months.

THE ME I WANT TO BE - 6 weeks - April 24 - May 29

There is a me each one of us wants to be. Someone who’s more kind and generous, patient and loving, but there is a gap between the me I am and the me I want to be. Often-times we find it easy to trust God to bridge that gap between us and him, but we struggle to really live by grace and trust God to bridge the gap between the me I am and the me I want to be. 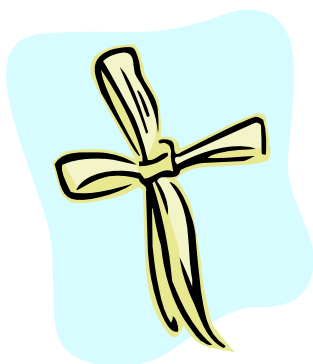

READERS WITH SPIRIT

TUMC's book club is meeting Monday, April 4 at 7pm in room 109 to discuss *The Bean Trees*, by Barbara Kingsolver.

It's time to start reading our next selection, *Just Beyond the Clouds*, by Karen Kingsbury, which we will be discussing when we meet Monday, May 2. *Just Beyond the Clouds* is the second in the Cody Gunner series. Cody Gunner is a talented but angry cowboy, top of his game, alone and intent on staying that way. Cody has rejected everything from his past, and only has room for his little brother Carl Joseph, born with Down Syndrome. In this continuing story of devotion, tragedy, and renewal, we see that while love often causes the heart to break, it's also the only thing that can mend it again.

A PERSPECTIVE ON ENGAGEMENT



Living through Lent and approaching Good Friday and Easter I reread the chapter “Engage the Spiritual Darkness” in Robert Wicks’ small book, “Riding the Dragon – 10 Lessons For Inner Strength In Challenging Times.” In that we all experience spiritual darkness at times. I’d like to share some of his thoughts.

Dr. Wicks writes, “Sometimes the sense of helplessness, confusion, loneliness and near despair we encounter at periods in our life is unavoidable. This spiritual darkness is not mere sadness, nor is it clinical depression, nor the result of poor coping skills. It is an existential confrontation with ourselves, the human condition, and with what and how we believe about life, fate and death. For some of us it is an existential confrontation with what we believe about God.”

Spiritual darkness may have a discernible precipitating event – loss of a spouse or dear friend, realizations of child sexual abuse, a serious illness, infidelity. These are only several of the more common triggers.

Whatever the case, the more important factor is recognizing spiritual darkness for what it is, namely both a devastatingly lonely experience and an opportunity for new spiritual and psychological depth.”

Dr. Wicks goes on to quote from an article by a Catholic nun entitled, “Impasse and the Dark Night of the Soul” “It is precisely as broken, poor

and powerless that one opens oneself to the dark mystery of God in loving, peaceful waiting. When the pain of human finitude is appropriated with a consciousness and consent and handed over in one’s own person to the influence of Jesus Spirit in the contemplative process, the new and deeper experience gradually takes over, the new vision gradually breaks through, and the new understanding and mutuality are progressively experienced.”

In his writing, “Spiritual darkness, when it is fully embraced and allowed to teach us lessons we wouldn’t learn if we were willfully in control, helps us to embrace the following essential lessons :

- We need to come home to God and ourselves more often in a spirit of prayer and meditation.
- Learning takes place when we join clarity and kindness.
- Great love is usually found in small deeds, not dramatic gestures or achievements.
- We must toughen our souls so we can deal with things that upset us.
- We need to travel light by erecting a “barrier of simplicity” between ourselves and the outside world.”

I hope this is a helpful perspective on what you’ve experienced at some point in your life and/or during Lent and as you live into Easter. And as you celebrate Easter I hope a new or renewed vision or understanding gradually breaks through.

VITAMIN D - DEFICIENCY



Dear TUMC friends,

What do muscle aches and bone pain as well as increased muscle weakness and an increased risk of falls, heart failure, and several forms of cancer all have in common?

If you answered vitamin D deficiency, you would be right on target naming this unsuspected epidemic. Vitamin D deficiency was first recognized as causing rickets, a disease seen in growing children in which poor mineralization of bone resulted in several clinical pictures – the most common being bowing of the legs. Rickets appeared treatable with as little as 100 IU (international units) of vitamin D, so the recommended 400IU per day seemed ample. Recent research is proving that assumption incorrect and it is becoming obvious that we are facing a global epidemic of vitamin D deficiency.

Vitamin D is made in the skin when sunshine or ultraviolet light converts the building blocks of vitamin D into the active vitamin D3.

How much sunshine do I need? – The amount depends on individual needs depending on where you live. In the northern and southern climates during the winter, the sun's rays are not strong enough to provide sufficient ultraviolet to produce vitamin D. The fear and risk of skin cancer has caused many to avoid sunlight and to use sunscreen agents. As with most things, balance is required to avoid the skin cancer risks on the one hand, and the vitamin D deficiency risks on the other. The amount of pigment in your skin is another factor, because it slows the formation of vitamin D. If you don't get enough sunshine (even in warm, southern climates many are so

homebound and office-bound that they don't) you may need supplemental vitamin D.

Vitamin D Deficiency increases risk for what diseases? A wide variety of problems associated with Vitamin D deficiency include osteoporosis, osteomalacia, increased risks of deadly cancers, cardiovascular disease, multiple sclerosis, rheumatoid arthritis, and type 1 diabetes mellitus. Muscle weakness with resulting falls and fractures, hypertension and infectious disease have all been implicated with the deficiency as well

How does Vitamin D deficiency affect bones? - Vitamin D is needed for calcium absorption. A lack of calcium has several effects. When the amount of calcium being absorbed is low parathyroid hormone levels rise and this hormone draws calcium from bones to defend blood levels, this means the bones may have less calcification from 2 mechanisms, less calcium available and more calcium being dragged out of the bones. Osteoporosis results in deformity, such as the humped back of the elderly.

How safe is it to take Vitamin D supplements? In a major review of the literature covering 176 studies, there was little evidence of any vitamin D toxicity at dosages currently being recommended. Massive doses of vitamin D may be troublesome, but 1,000 IU per day would be very helpful to most people.

Next month we will be discussing Calcium and how it relates to Vitamin D – stay tuned for more!

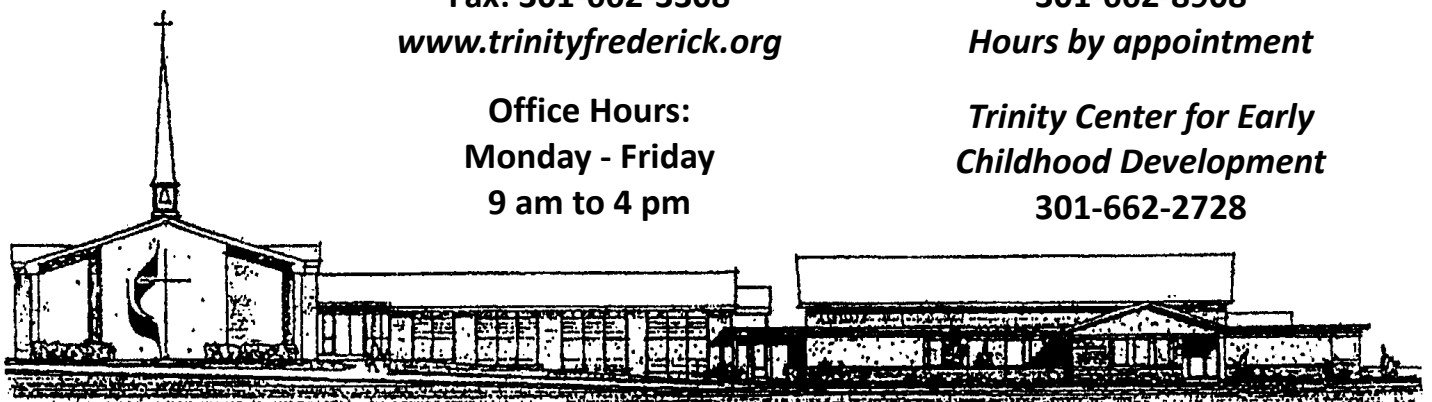
