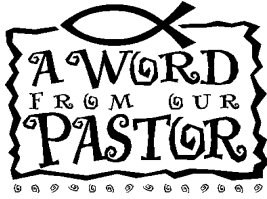

PASTOR'S PAGE



In her book, *The Offense of Grace*, Susan R. Andrews relates that William Willimon tells the story of a funeral he attended when he was serving a small congregation in rural Georgia. One of his members' relatives died, so Willimon and his wife attended the funeral held in a country Baptist church. He writes: "I had never seen anything like it. The preacher began to preach. He shouted; he flailed his arms. 'It's too late for Joe. He's dead. But it ain't too late for you. People drop dead every day. Why wait? Now is the day for decision. Give your life to Jesus.'"

Willimon goes on to suggest that this was the worst thing he had ever seen. He fumed and fussed at his wife Patsy, complaining that the preacher had done the worst thing possible for a grieving family – manipulating them with guilt and shame. Patsy agreed. But then she said: "Of course the worst part of it all is that what he said is true."

Advent began on Sunday, November 27, and continues until Sunday, December 25. This season which begins the Christian year and helps to prepare us for the

coming of Christ into our hearts and lives at Christmas brings both a warning and a promise. The warning is that as the country preacher so clumsily foretold, each of us must deal with the dark reality of the end of our time as well as the end of the world's time. This warning casts a shadow over the beginning of the season, while preparing us for the happy ending – the good news. The promise of Advent is that in the darkness, in the shadows, God is present. God is in control. God will come again. With each candle we light, the shadows recede a little, and the promise comes closer. With each candle we light, we are proclaiming that the light shines in the darkness and the darkness will never overcome it. The promise is that wherever there is darkness and dread in our lives, wherever there is darkness and dread in the world around us, God is there to help us endure. God is in charge and hope is alive. No matter how long the night may seem, morning will come in God's good time.

Join us for worship this month as we celebrate The Shining Lights of Advent each Sunday at 8:45 and 11:10 and the birth of our Savior at 10:00 on Christmas Day.

STEPHEN MINISTRY REFLECTIONS

After Stephen Ministry Sunday on October 16, several Trinity parishioners asked questions about how many care-receivers we have served since Trinity became an enrolled congregation with Stephen Ministries St. Louis. I thought I would relate some of those "statistics".

So far a total of 19 individuals have been or are currently being served by Trinity's Stephen Ministers.

Trinity Members	9
Non-members	10

Many different issues have prompted these individuals to seek the assistance of a Stephen Minister including depression, marital problems, divorce, debt, spouse illness, grandson's suicide, death of a spouse, care-receiver facing aging issues and death, loss of job, alcohol abuse, prioritizing time between work and family.

The length of time that these individuals have been visited by a Stephen Minister has also varied greatly.

- Two have been as short as 3 visits over 4-5 weeks.
- Several lasted 13-16 weeks.

- Several lasted 28-40 weeks.
- Several lasted one year.
- The longest lasted two years, 81/2 months.
- Five are currently still in progress from just beginning to 92 weeks.

Our two "snow bird" Stephen Ministers (Bob and Sara Platz) are going to Florida for the winter and we wish them a safe journey.

That leaves four of our Stephen Ministers currently awaiting a new assignment. If you or someone you know could benefit by having a Stephen Minister, please talk to Pastor Lynn Wilson.

I hope this "statistics" article has answered some of your questions. If you have other questions, please ask any of our Stephen Leaders: Pastor Lynn Wilson, Heather Throckmorton or Nancy Boyd.

KEEP THE SUGGESTIONS COMING!

Thank you to all of you who have sent suggestions in response to the financial letter that we recently sent out. Below are a few of the suggestions to save or raise money that we have received so far. Some of them need people to manage them, so please let us know if you wish to handle any of the following suggestions.

1. Eliminate the weekly offering envelopes. This would save the church several thousand dollars a year. However, before we completely eliminate the envelopes that are mailed to your home, we would like to hear from anyone that simply must have the envelopes mailed to them. We would have blank envelopes available in the pews or you can simply put your check in the offering plate on Sunday. We are checking with our bank to see about the availability of online giving as well.
2. Break down to the congregation how we could increase giving by \$80,000 by the end of the year as this is an insurmountable amount. As of November 1 in order to cover this need, every giving unit would have to give an extra \$31.25 per week through the end of the year. This is certainly easier to digest than a large number.
3. A November Pie Walk just like our December Cookie Walk. People make and donate pies right before Thanksgiving. Another idea is to have Catoctin Mt Orchard sell us some pies at a reduced rate and we could take orders and fill them.
4. Collecting aluminum cans for recycling and cash.
5. Walk for missions – take donations and raise \$ per mile from co-workers, family, etc.
6. Pre-sold dinners one night a week
7. Public dinners/breakfasts

Parents of prospective preschoolers often ask me about our curriculum at Trinity Preschool. They ask if we teach our students to write the alphabet. They ask if we teach a foreign language or offer lessons on musical instruments. Many parents think their three-year-olds or four-year-olds will be bored in preschool because they can already count to twenty or recognize the entire alphabet.

While these are valuable skills, getting ready to go to kindergarten involves more than learning colors, shapes, numbers and letters. Some other important skills that we practice every day at preschool include learning the proper way to use scissors, how to hold your marker correctly when you write your name, listening to directions when a teacher is talking, taking turns with classmates during an activity, getting used to talking in front of a group, cleaning up after playtime or snack time, independently putting on coats and mittens, using words to resolve conflicts with others, and much more!

HOLIDAY GIFTS AND TRADITIONS



"Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights..."

James 1:17 NIV

A harried woman and her children were ending their day of holiday shopping. To express her frustration and stress, she stated that whoever created Christmas should be strung up and shot. A bystander brought to her attention that someone had already crucified him. Before you get caught up with your tasks, lists, and expectations, put them into perspective. Ask yourself what you should be celebrating: the hectic, stress-laden, financially burdened holiday season, or the gift of peace and hope.

Even though God gives us all we need for a healthy, happy life, we tend to disturb it by "spending" and "observing" the holiday on human terms. Look at the holiday traps that take up your time. Categorize your holiday tasks as "need to do," "should do," "want to do," and "expected to do." Which ones really address the Christmas spirit? Just because you are invited to attend an event or have habitually participated in an activity doesn't mean you have to continue that activity. Prioritize all of your activities. By weeding out those that distract you from the true meaning of Christmas, you will find less stress and more enjoyment from your choices.

Advent is a time for hope, peace, joy, and love, not mounds of gifts, chaotic rounds of parties, or copious amounts of food. Consider what has real meaning for

you. Is it the Christmas story you heard as a child or its impact on you as an adult? Think about the music of the holiday and how a stirring rendition of "Joy to the World" or a quiet performance of "Silent Night" displays love and peace in a harried world. Don't let commercialism or stress overshadow the gifts of love and sharing that you offer your loved ones.

Remember the spirit of Christmas, share your presence with others, reduce your stress, and create meaningful traditions that demonstrate God's love.
