Not by making your life always pleasant,

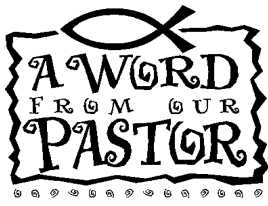
But by showing you when people and their causes need you

STEPHEN MINISTRY REFLECTIONS

The Grace of Assertive Affirmations

But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect... 1 Peter 3:15

Very often these days and as it seems, on the increase, I hear people responding, “No problem” to another person saying, “Thank you”. “No problem” is a **meek or passive response**, lessening the service provided. As Christians, we do need to remain humble, but I don’t ever remember Jesus being meek.

Jesus was **always** assertive. Sometimes Jesus assertively chose not to respond, but this choice was to accomplish his ministry of salvation most effectively and was following the will of God in his life. Even when Jesus was compassionate, it was not a passive sadness, but an assertive, proactive caring about the individual. When the Pharisees confronted him with the adulterous woman and the Law of Moses that the woman should be stoned to death, he responded ‘Whichever one of you has committed no sin may throw the first stone at

her’ (John 8:7). His quiet, yet assertive challenge made each of them confront their own sin and lose some of their self-righteousness.

Assertive behavior honors both self and others. Assertive behavior reflects honesty, and is direct and open. It includes giving as well as receiving compliments. Saying, “Thank you” is in a way expressing a compliment for a service provided. Responding, “You’re welcome” is the assertive way of receiving that compliment. You honestly acknowledge that the service you provided was genuinely appreciated.

As we begin the new year of our Lord, 2012, let us remember his grace, let us work on being more assertive Christians and let us start by assertively responding, **“You are welcome”** when someone thanks us for providing a service.

A FAITH PERSPECTIVE ON CAREGIVING



As Diane Younkens said, "Although to different degrees, we are all caregivers in ways and at times". I'd therefore like to share some thoughts on caregiving that I have gathered from different resources.

In her book "Compassionate Christian Caregiving" Lois Knuston describes caring for her mother like a firefighter. "In response to a medical, psychological, socioeconomic or family crisis I tried to put it out. I knew I needed something deeper to keep me going, in addition to my love for Mom. My perspective on caregiving made a big difference."

William Willimon wrote, "We will burn out in Christian caregiving unless we develop within ourselves an autonomous inner conviction that what we are doing is worthwhile, is what we are called to."

Sharon writes about caring for her husband, "Caregiving had a profound effect on my life and it changed who I was and who I am today...I realized I had to cling tightly to my faith in order to survive.. My wellness trait will be HOPE. Hope tells me what I do in caregiving is important and has eternal consequences." And, "through our faith there is always a "nevertheless" in every overwhelming and sad circumstance. Caregiving is often so discouraging and heartbreaking. Nevertheless..." How might you fill in this sentence?

Scripture Says...

"Then Jesus said to His disciples, If anyone wishes to come after Me, let Him take up his cross, and follow Me." Matthew 16:24. We are invited to reach beyond our broken condition to find new life. In hope, our own suffering opens us to the pain of others.

Offering of self comes at a cost. God did not reveal Himself as the powerful other, unapproachable in all His knowing, power and control. Instead He came to us in Jesus Christ who "did not cling to His equality with God but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men." *Philippians 2:6&7.*

We know that we can't fix everything but we can "sanctify Christ as Lord in our hearts, always ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence." *1 Peter 3:15*

We are cracked and imperfect vessels but usable and beloved by God. "But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the surpassing greatness of the power may be of God and not from ourselves." *2 Cor. 4:7.*

Life is not defined by happiness. Life is about the amazing love of God who wants us to find deep meaning and

purpose, and to give courage and hope. "Come to Me all who are weary and heavy-laden and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn of Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart; and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My load is light." *Matt. 11:28-30.*

Don't lose heart. God has entrusted you with a Holy calling and a promise. Read Isaiah 43:1-4.

View your caregiving as a spiritual experience in which you follow Jesus's three fold calling. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." *Luke 11:27*

1. Loving God. Recognize, remember God's love for you and love God in return. You are God's care recipient just as your loved one is. God loves you both.
2. Loving your care recipient. Your care recipient is your "neighbor". God loves them with their imperfections just as God loves you with yours. Your loved ones value is not diminished in God's eyes because they are less mobile or less alert. This according to the authors of a book called "Aging Together" is a call to "subversive friendship". "Congregations are called to be schools of subversive friendship, subversive because they do not follow the script of the prevailing culture, which argues that there should always be a practical return for friendship"... relationship.
 - a. Offer them the same esteem and care with which you would want to be treated if the role were reversed. Matthew 7:12
 - b. Reach out to them with sacrificial compassion as Jesus teaches in the parable of the Good Samaritan. Luke 10:29-37.
 - c. Place a spiritual focus on daily caregiving tasks. Galatians 3:26
 - d. Be kind, affirming and encouraging.
 - e. Empower them
 - f. Combine past positive memories with your loved one's present situation.
 - g. Share physical tenderness if appropriate.
 - h. Keep in mind that loving your care recipient takes more effort when you have negative memories.
3. Love yourself. Learn about and look for signs of burn out. Identify the best ways to take care of yourself and give yourself permission to do just that.
