

Dear Trinity Family,

We are now officially 'Breaking Free'. As was announced on Sunday, May 1, our total cash received for this campaign is \$185,174 in cash, checks and stocks and the amount of pledged donations is at \$654,000. The cash and checks were deposited and immediately applied to the principle portion of our mortgage. The stocks have been received by our broker and upon completion of the sales transaction, will be deposited and also immediately applied to the mortgage principle.

Each month as pledges are honored they will be deposited into the Breaking Free account, which is separate from our operating account. At the end of each month they will be applied to the mortgage principle. For the next three years we will ensure that:

- All Breaking Free funds will be applied to the mortgage principle until it is paid off.
- Funds will then accumulate in the Breaking Free account until the congregation approves their release.
- No Breaking Free funds will be used to pay the mortgage interest. Interest on the mortgage will be paid out of the church's operating fund.

Our Breaking Free commitment is above and in addition to, our regular giving. Weekly giving supports the regular operating expenses of the church such as: salaries, the apportionment, programs, maintenance, utilities, etc. By maintaining our weekly giving, while honoring our Breaking Free commitment, we will support the operation of our church and its many activities and events. We will also maintain the connected relationship we have with the larger United Methodist Community.

God has blessed Trinity Church by providing members who give sacrificially, lay leaders who serve unselfishly, and professional staff who work tirelessly in ministry. Together, with HIS continued blessing, we will ensure that Trinity Church will remain a vital part of our vibrant community.

STEPHEN MINISTRY REFLECTIONS

Lay persons as ministers? How can that be?



Such is the confidence that we have through Christ toward God. Not that we are competent of ourselves to claim anything as coming from us; our competence is

from God, who has made us competent to be ministers of a new covenant, not of letter but of spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.

Now if the ministry of death, chiseled in letters on stone tablets, came in glory so that the people of Israel could not gaze at Moses' face because of the glory of his face, a glory now set aside, how much more will the ministry of the Spirit come in glory? For if there was glory in the ministry of condemnation, much more does the ministry of justification abound in glory! Indeed, what once had glory has lost its glory because of the greater glory, for if what was set aside came through glory, much more has the permanent come in glory!

Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only as Christ is it set aside. Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; but when one

turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another, for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit. 2 Corinthians 3: 4-18

We are all ministers if we abide in Christ. Apart from Christ we can do nothing. With Christ, our ministry can bear much fruit. We are called to abide. How do we abide in Christ? We need to practice spiritual disciplines, which for Christians include:

- Regular participation in worship
- Regular participation in communion and other sacraments
- Meditation
- Reading scripture, daily devotionals, and Christian literature for study and reflection
- Prayer
- Fasting
- Journaling
- Small group participation
- Spiritual direction (a mentor who helps the one seeking direction to discern God's will and suggests avenues for greater growth)

Being a minister through Christ can be extremely rewarding. Try it.

CHRYSALIS August 4-7

What is Chrysalis you ask? Before it becomes a butterfly, a caterpillar goes through a growth stage during which it is called a "chrysalis." On the surface it may not look like much is happening, but the delicate chrysalis process changes the fuzzy caterpillar into an awesome butterfly with wings of intricate designs and intense colors. The chrysalis process symbolizes how Christ can transform you into something beyond your dreams. It happens when you grow beyond yourself, opening your life to Jesus' power and love.

"Chrysalis" is the name chosen for the youth version of The Walk to Emmaus, its parent movement, because it symbolizes the spiritual growth that is essential between adolescence and adulthood. TIME OUT FOR MEN'S HEALTH



be aware of their health!!

Just like taking the car in for an oil change or the 25,000 mile check-up, men also need to take themselves to the doctor's office to make sure everything is running smoothly.

Statistics show that men do not see a physician for a physical exam nearly as often as women, nor are they as likely to receive health screenings to prevent the onset of more serious conditions. There is an ongoing, increasing and predominantly silent crisis in the health and well being of men. Due to a lack of awareness, poor health education, and culturally induced behavior patterns in their work and personal lives, men's health and well being are deteriorating steadily.

The men's health crisis is seen most dramatically in mortality figures. In 1920, the life expectancy of males and females was roughly the same. Since that time and, increasingly, in the 1970's and 1980's, the life expectancy for men has dropped in comparison with that of women. The average life expectancy (1991) for black men is 65 years, that of black women is 73 years. The average life expectancy for white men is 71 years, that of

June is designated as Men's Health awareness month, and men need to

white women is 78 years. Over the last thirty years, the ratio of male mortality over female mortality has increased in every age category.

Heart attacks scare men into lifestyle changes. They quit smoking, eat healthier and start exercising on a more regular basis. Unfortunately, it's a bit late.. Cardiovascular disease clearly is the number one cause of death in men. The biggest challenge is not in making an accurate diagnosis when presented with the abnormal lab results, but rather getting young adult men into care. As long as men keep waiting until they are 50 plus years old to go in to see a doctor, then we will continue to see the sex-based mortality gap.

Change requires action. We all need to affect some positive changes sooner in men's approaches to their health if we plan to reduce their unnecessary premature mortality.

WISDOM AT THE KITCHEN TABLE



Recently I watched a running race from our front stoop. One of the things that I enjoyed and found interesting is the uniqueness of each person's running

style. Each person's way of running is as unique as their fingerprint. The runners were all people, they were all running, but each person was doing it in their own way.

This is part of what I also enjoy about being a counselor. I have the privilege of hearing people's stories. While there are common themes each story is about each person's unique way of experiencing, responding to and being in the world. I feel fortunate but it is an experience that everyone – in a slightly different way – can have.

In her book, "Kitchen Table Wisdom", Rachel Naomi Remen, M.D. describes the opportunity and the blessing of listening to each other's stories around the kitchen table. She writes,

"Everybody is a story. When I was a child, people sat around kitchen tables and told their stories. We don't do that so much anymore. Sitting around the table telling stories is not just a way of passing time. It is the way wisdom gets passed along. The stuff that helps us live a life worth remembering. Despite the awesome powers of technology many of us still do not live very well. We may need to listen to each other's stories once again.

The stories we can tell each other have no

beginning and ending. They are a front row seat to the real experience. Even though they may have happened in a different time or place they have a familiar feel. In some way they are about us, too.

The kitchen table is a level playing field. Everyone's story matters. The wisdom in the story of the most educated and powerful person is often not greater than the wisdom in the story of a child, and the life of a child can teach us as much as the life of a sage.

Most parents know the importance of telling children their own story, over and over again, so that they come to know in the tellings who they are and to whom they belong. At the kitchen table we do this for each other. Hidden in all stories is the One story. The more we listen, the clearer that Story becomes. Our true identity, who we are, why we are here, what sustains us, is in this story. The stories at every kitchen table are about the same things, stories of owning, having and losing, of power, of wounding, of courage, hope, and healing, of loneliness and the end of loneliness. Stories about God.

In telling them, we are telling each other the human story. Stories that touch us in this place of common humanness awaken us and weave us together as a family once again."

Enjoy the opportunity and the blessing as you gather at the table.
