

BREAKING FREE UPDATE

All of these figures regarding our capital campaign, "Breaking Free", are current as of September 17, 2011:

- 170 pledges have been made towards "Breaking Free". A total of \$665,884 has been pledged. This is slightly higher than we reported previously.
- 136 of our pledgers have made donations towards "Breaking Free". The total amount that has been given is \$222,259.
- Of this amount, \$207,798.74 has been applied towards our mortgage principal.
- On 6/30/11, our TUMC mortgage principal was \$343,524.44.
On 9/17/11, our TUMC mortgage principal was \$317,096.54

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STEPHEN MINISTRY REFLECTIONS

Obedience and Compassion - Part II

Last month's article left Jonah reflecting about his disobedience to God while inside the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

From inside the fish Jonah prayed to the Lord his God... And the Lord commanded the fish, and it vomited Jonah onto dry land. Jonah 2:1, 10

Jonah obeyed the Lord, went to Nineveh and proclaimed throughout the city that it would be overthrown in 40 days. The people and the king believed God, fasted, put on sackcloth, and repented.

When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he had compassion and did not bring upon them the destruction he had threatened. Jonah 3:10

Jonah became angry because he still wanted the Assyrians destroyed. Jonah went out of the city, made a 'booth' for himself and sat down still hoping Nineveh would be destroyed. God made a bush create shade over Jonah, which made him happy. The next day, God appointed a worm to eat the bush causing the sun to beat down on Jonah until he became faint.

He said, "It is better for me to die than to live." But God said to Jonah, "Is it right for you to be angry about the bush?" And he said, "Yes, angry enough to die." Then the Lord said, "You are concerned about the bush, for which you did not labor and which you did not grow; it came into being in a night and perished in a night. And should I not be concerned about Nineveh, that great city, in which

there are more than a hundred and twenty thousand persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also many animals?" Jonah 4:8b-11

It was discipline for Jonah to be swallowed by the fish teaching him obedience to God's call; it was discipline for Jonah to have his shade bush wither and fall at his feet teaching him compassion. God was teaching Jonah that he needed to love his 'neighbor', including those hostile and oppressive.

Jesus spoke of the sign of Jonah.

Then some of the scribes and Pharisees said to him. "Teacher, we wish to see a sign from you." But he answered them. "An evil and adulterous generation asks for a sign, but no sign will be given to it except the sign of the prophet Jonah. For just as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the sea monster, so for three days and three nights the Son of Man will be in the heart of the earth. The people of Nineveh will rise up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it, because they repented at the proclamation of Jonah, and see, something greater than Jonah is here!" Matthew 12:38-41

As Christians we need to allow God through the ministry of Jesus reshape us to be merciful, loving, outreaching people just as he reshaped Jonah.

Trinity has been an enrolled congregation with Stephen Ministries, St. Louis since 2007 when Pastor Lynn Wilson and Heather Throckmorton became our first Stephen Leaders and began to build our team. A Stephen Minister is a lay Christian who provides one-to-one distinctively Christian care to others on behalf of their enrolled congregation.

September 12, 2011 began the third Stephen Ministry training class at Trinity. We ask your prayers for the Stephen Leaders teaching this class, for all of our current Stephen Ministers and for the students in this new class. They will be attending 50 hours of training before they will be commissioned in February 2012.

On Laity Sunday, October 16, Trinity will celebrate our Stephen Ministry program. We hope you will join us on this special day.

A WORD ON FASTING AND PRAYER

As presented by The Prayer Ministry of Frazer Memorial United Methodist Church



Fasting refers to the abstinence from food for spiritual purposes. In the Old Testament fasting was most often observed in the connection with times of distress, trouble, or affliction. It involved mourning over sin, repentance and seeking God's face.

Fasting is a way to humble ourselves before God, and in scripture was often seen when seeking guidance from God. In Psalm 35:13 David says, "...I put on sackcloth and humbled myself with fasting." And in Ezra 8:21, "there by the Ahava Canal, I proclaimed a fast so that we might humble ourselves before God."

Fasting is the spiritual discipline shown in scripture to cause us to humble ourselves before God, and humility is a prerequisite to fellowship with the Lord. In the New testament we see fasting by the early church in seeking God's guidance and direction. Acts 13:2 "While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabus and Saul for the work to which I have called them.'" In Acts 14:23, "Paul and Barnabus appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, committed them to the Lord, in whom they put their trust."

We also see Jesus teaching "when you fast" not "if you fast" in Matthew 6:16. In Matthew 9:15, Jesus said that the time for His disciples to fast would be after he was taken from them. In our modern culture we are so appetite and pleasure driven that many have an aversion to the discipline of fasting. Fortunately there is a new awareness as Christians across our country are beginning to practice this almost lost discipline of the Christian faith.

WHY FAST?

- It humbles us and reminds us of our own inadequacies and dependence upon God.
- It reveals things that control us... pride, anger, bitterness, jealousy, greed and fear will surface during fasting.
- It draws our focus away from ourselves to God. It deepens our relationship with God.
- It helps us keep balance and perspective in our lives... what's really important.
- It helps us live out the spiritual principle of self-denial that says we are serious about seeking God.
- It's as if we are saying, "My body belongs to you and my appetites and desires are devoted wholly to you, Lord."

RIGHT MOTIVES

- To humble ourselves before God
- To deepen our relationship with God
- To repent or mourn over sin (personal, corporate, national)
- To seek God's will or direction in our lives
- To glorify God with our bodies

WRONG MOTIVES

- To manipulate God to do what we want
- To earn merit for ourselves
- To impress God or others with our spirituality
- To fulfill a religious duty or habit
- To lose weight

PRACTICAL TIPS

1. Determine Your Purpose

- Why are you fasting? What will you be praying about specifically?

“Through fasting an prayer we humble ourselves before God so the holy Spirit will stir our souls, awaken our churches, and heal our land according to 2 Chronicles 7:14. Make this a priority in your fasting.”

2. Decide the Nature of Your Fast

- How long will you fast?... One meal, one day, three days, one week , forty days
- What type of fast will you do?... Water only, water and juices, partial giving up certain foods
- What activities will you restrict?

3. Prepare Yourself Spiritually & Physically

- Allow adequate time for heart searching a, confession, seeking forgiveness, forgiving others, and surrendering to God in obedience.
- Don't rush into your fast. Especially if it is to last more that one day
 - Wean your self from caffeine.
 - Eat lighter meals a day or so before beginning (avoid high fat and sugary foods).
 - Don't stock up the night before.
 - Expect some grouchiness and irritability.

- Expect some hunger pains, headaches, dizziness, or weakness the first day or so.

4. Follow A Schedule

- Set aside time in the morning or private worship and praise
- At lunch time spend a few minutes in God's Word and prayer. Perhaps take a shor walk as you pray.
- In the evening get alone for a relaxed time of seeking God's face or spend extra prayer time with your spouse, family or a friend.
- Avoid television and other distractions.
- If you are drinking juices, drink the juices at regular meals times.
- Allow more time than usual for rest.

5. End Your Fast Gradually

- Do not eat a large meal in celebration after any extended fast (more than one day).
- Break your fast gradually with fruit and raw vegetables.
- If you have been on an extended fast, while drinking juices add the following:

First day: Add a raw salad

Second Day: Add baked/boiled potato, no seasoning or butter

Third Day: Add a steamed vegetable

Fourth Day: Begin to resume your normal diet.

Remember: Fasting without prayer is meaningless sacrifice. It is prayer coupled with fasting that can release God's power in our lives.

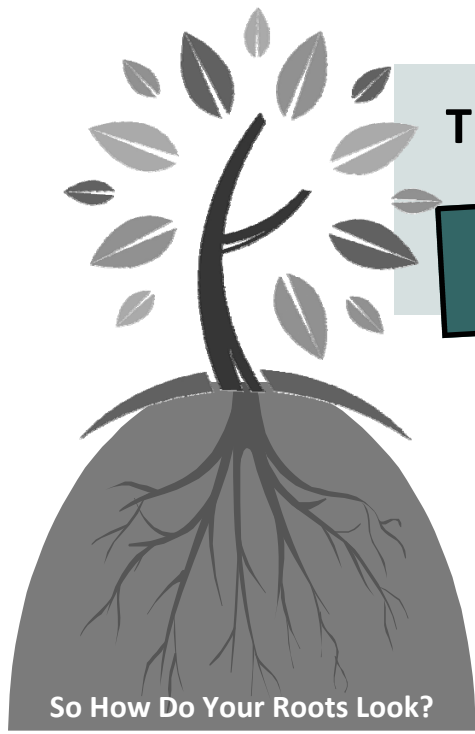
