(12:1-3).

The God we serve in Jesus the Messiah began a new journey for the human family, and you have been invited to participate in this new thing that God has been doing, is doing, and will continue to do. As a matter of fact God expect us to be engaged with God in this constant act of creation, and re-creation. This is why Paul says in 2 Corinthians:

If we put all our trust in the Lord we will experience the greatness of God, we will experience the goodness of our God, and we will be the people who, working with God, will bring forward the transformation God desires for our church, our communities, and the world.

Come, join in the journey of creating and re-creating that which God desires. You have been called by God to be God's hands and feet. Let the transformation begin!!

We want to express our deepest gratitude to Trinity and all those who generously give of their time, talents, resources, and prayers. We are grateful to those who serve on the committee to help us stay focused on the church's ministry in the community. We thank the Trustees for their role in tending to the property so that clients can meet in a safe and comfortable space. Thank you to the TUMC staff who help with the many tasks that help the center to run smoothly.

We also want to thank the congregation whose collections help serve the clients we see who cannot afford counseling otherwise. At the time we wrote this article (mid-December 2019), we had received \$2449 from church donors through Trinity in 2019. Individuals who donate directly to TPCC gave \$1370 in 2019. #### **Harmony Without Uniformity**

As followers of Jesus Christ we are challenged to grow beyond ourselves, to expand our horizons, so that we come to include actions for others in our spheres of concern. Reaching this point often comes after encountering a situation or idea that throws our

world into turmoil, upsets our spiritual equilibrium, leads us to conclude something should be done to correct the situation.

Therefore, we empathize with the plight of others, we are disturbed by the homelessness of an army veteran, outraged by the injustice suffered by an innocent person who has spent 35 years wrongfully imprisoned, or incensed by an inhumane government policy that intentionally separates young children from their parents. However, we are frequently perplexed as to what actions we can personally take that will make a difference.

First and foremost we can become better informed about the challenging issue and what led to the unacceptable current state of affairs. How do you do this? Read about the matter, find and watch relevant online videos, seek out and talk to people about the issue. Write, e-mail, and/or telephone decision makers to let them know of your concerns. Make your voice part of the chorus saying we can do better than this!

Once you are on the path of proactively advocating for a change in policy, a change in how an issue is handled, a change in business as usual, you will undoubtedly encounter opposing ideas, even among people who fundamentally agree with you. It is at this point that you come to realize the importance of harmony without uniformity. As long as we share common ground, for example that all humans have a right to exist in a safe environment, we can debate the means by which this is accomplished with open hearts and minds, actively listening and hearing challenges to our positions. From differing positions we can then find common ground to make this a better, more humane world.

### **Operation Christmas Child: Shoebox Wrap Up** (pun intended)

On November 3<sup>rd</sup> approximately 60 people from Trinity and the community spent the afternoon packing **1000 shoeboxes** with items donated throughout the year. Together with shoebox gifts that were received by church members, and some additional boxes packed during National Collection Week, Trinity was able to provide 1201 shoeboxes to be distributed to children in need all over the world!

Trinity serves as the Central Drop Off Location during National Collection Week, and *received* 14,845 *shoeboxes from individuals, churches, schools and other* 



groups from Frederick and Carroll Counties. All needed to be counted, put in cartons and then loaded in trucks (it took three, 28-foot trucks to fit them all), before being transported to the processing center in Charlotte, North Carolina. 17 dedicated volunteers spent a total of 267 hours making sure donors were greeted, shoe box labels were secure and that the boxes were properly accounted for.

December 2<sup>nd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>, Trinity sent a team of nine people to the *Operation Christmas Child Processing Center in Boone, North Carolina for a week of inspecting and preparing the boxes for shipment.* For 6 weeks the warehouse is abuzz with volunteers from all over the country working to ensure the shoeboxes are safe and appropriate for the children. Boone is one of eight processing centers across the country, and collectively, approximately 11 million shoeboxes need to be inspected before being transported by plane or ship to their country of destination. Once there, they will be transported by boat, car, truck, camel, donkey, elephant --- whatever means necessary to reach the hands of a child.

It has been a year long project for Trinity, collecting and sorting donated gifts, making crafts, and fundraising for the shipping money required to get the boxes to their final destinations. And it would not be possible without the generosity of so many from Trinity contributing their time, resources and prayers. These boxes bless the children that receive them as well as their families with the message of God's love and the Good News of Jesus Christ. Thank you for your commitment to this ministry and for your heart for children of the world. **We give all praise and glory to God for allowing us to be a part of sharing His love in this way.**
