Reflecting on John Wesley: Church and Society Ministry

At this time when the USA is being called on to fully address its continuing history of racial oppression amidst an unprecedented pandemic, the Church and Society Ministry would like to bring to your attention an article on John Wesley and his relevancy for conservatives by Michael Gerson that appeared in the June 16, 2020 Washington Post.

Perhaps we followers of the tenets set forth by John Wesley, Methodism, can also be guided by the columnist's conclusions about Wesley's stance on dehumanizing social practices.

Gerson writes, (Those) "... seeking guidance on dealing with racial matters have much to learn from Wesley: his passion for human dignity, his embrace of empathy, his willingness to follow the demands of justice beyond his ideological comfort zone. Even as a conservative, Wesley demonstrated that a sincere, consistent commitment to human dignity is more radical than most imagine."

As we go forth each day living our lives based on the teachings of Jesus Christ, let each of us strive to ensure that the actions we undertake and/or endorse are based on human dignity, love for our fellow persons, and a willingness to follow what these first two demand in terms of justice.

The month of July is dedicated to National Minority Mental Health Awareness month.

Since 2008, this month has been dedicated to the education and awareness of the unique needs of minority groups. NAMI has approached this with the saying, "Strength over Silence."

Several years ago, laws were enacted so that mental health was supposed to be on equal footing with physical care. While some aspects are getting better, parity hasn't happened. Disparities between the general population and minority groups exist at an even higher rate. Various stressors and stigma add to the challenges that many people of color may experience.

The Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) reports that racial and ethnic minority groups in the U.S. are less likely to have access to mental health services, less likely to use community mental health services, more likely to use emergency departments, and more likely to receive lower quality care. Poor mental health care access and quality contribute to poor mental health outcomes, including suicide, among racial and ethnic minority populations.


