From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Trinity family, during the last several months we have lived things we never expected. We are in the middle of a worldwide pandemic, we have gone through an incredibly challenging electoral process, we have been seeing brothers and sisters in the church attacked each other because of their political ideas, and convictions. We have experienced how some of our members have lost their jobs and their sources of income, we have known of people at the brink of homelessness, we have known friends and family members who have lost their loved ones due to COVID-19. This year some of us have lost friends and people we cared for due to other medical conditions. These have been challenging times.

We have experienced our services moving from the sanctuary to the internet, then to the parking lot and live streaming, then to live streaming only, and the world goes on. We have experienced how our General and Jurisdictional Conferences have been postponed until further notice, as well as decisions about the future of our denomination,

and the election of new Episcopal leaders. The annual meeting of the Baltimore Washington Conference took place on-line for the first time in our history. The ordination of Elders and Deacons in the Baltimore Washington Conference took place online as well, a first for all of us. This has been indeed a challenging time.

We have been plunged into unchartered waters, we have walked into unknown territories, we have dared to live in uncertainty trusting that God is there with us, trusting that we have a community of brothers and sisters willing to walk along these paths of uncertainties. We have dared to trust that God is walking with us in the midst of all this uncertainty, and we have dared to celebrate the presence of God in our midst; we have dared to live praising God, giving God glory in the midst of all the challenges we have been confronting.

This is why we find rest and strength in the words of Paul to the Ephesians:

"In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory.

-Ephesians 1:11-12

You and I are destined, according to the purpose of God, to give God glory and praise in all we do, in the midst of all circumstances.

Today we have been given the opportunity to do things new, to do things differently. We have been given the opportunity to reach out and welcome new people into our fellowship not only through visitation of our sanctuary but also through the internet. In this process, we have come to realize that we cannot take things for granted. Now we are looking forward to becoming a new community of faith born out of separation and distance. Perhaps we can be bold and claim that we are the New Trinity United Methodist Church of Frederick, MD.

Let your family, friends, and neighbors know that we are celebrating life, transformation, community, and renewal because God is doing something new with us.



- 2.) if there ever was a call to slow down, this pandemic is an invitation to do that.



What worked has been that various church staff and volunteers helped make payment easier for clients, including adding an option to the website. What worked has been that the committee provided support and oversight. What worked was continuing to receive donations and grants that help offset client needs.
