Jesus' example is strange: he never welcomed anyone to his home the way some of the other Biblical stories describe hospitality, but he welcomed people into his loving embrace. The woman who was hemorrhaging. The man with demons. Tax collectors and sinners and even people who disagreed with him. The criminals beside him on the cross. In our own lives, we also might remember the feeling of being welcomed into Jesus' loving embrace too.

Thank you for being so much like Jesus to me in this transition. I look forward to the ways we can be radically hospitable in our community as well!

May we pour out our hearts so all people know how welcome they are into God's loving embrace.




