

Dear friends,

Do you have a perfect life? I don't know about you, but until we started struggling with infertility and later miscarriage, and then losing my mother-in-law, and then Autumn - before all of that I thought I could work myself into a perfect life. I think, even if we aren't all perfectionists, many of us think that if we work hard enough, or pray hard enough, or believe deeply enough, we will have if not a perfect life than a pretty darn good one. Some of us think God requires this

perfection of us. And when we feel like our lives have fallen short, or even have fallen apart, we sometimes think something is wrong with us. Maybe we even think God has abandoned us.

Kate Bowler (www.katebowler.com) is a seminary history professor at Duke and an author and podcaster, writes of her own struggle seeking perfection before she was diagnosed with stage 4 colon cancer. In a recent op-ed, she said:

Every year, billions of dollars are pumped into a wellness industry defined by the theory that we can be perfected. We can organize ourselves, heal ourselves, budget ourselves, love ourselves, track ourselves and eat well enough to make ourselves whole....Salvation is only a decision away.

But I cannot outwork or outpace or out-pray my cancer. I can't dispel it with a can-do attitude.

After a diagnosis. After a pandemic. That is the right time to question our popular theories about how to build a better life. We cannot "have it all" if we just learn how to conquer our limits. Infinity isn't at the bottom of your inbox or in the next level on the Peloton. The problem with our lives is that we cannot solve them. We can only live them.

We can't solve our lives. We can only live them. This is, strangely enough, a message for Lent.

Now Lent is often overtaken by perfection. We proclaim: look at us fasting from candy so well! Look at us reading our Bible so diligently every day. Or, the opposite: we was trying to fast from sugar, but we couldn't do it. Not even for God. Why are we so awful? Stop. Lent has become a tool of perfection, but that's not what it is supposed to be. What if, this Lent, we stopped trying to be perfect, and instead were "Good Enough," embracing the imperfections of life and faith?

The Good News certainly is that God loves us deeply and is present to us powerfully, even and especially in the midst of the imperfect and down-right crappy moments of life.

We are still in the midst of great disturbance from "the way we imagined" life to be. In many cases, dreams have been thwarted by pandemic through loss of life, health, and economic security. And then there's all the other hard stuff, unrelated to pandemic, that just keeps rollin' along. My prayer is that this Lent will be salve for our frustrated selves, inviting us to embrace the imperfections of life and faith, knowing that we are never alone.

From the TRINITY PASTORAL COUNSELING CENTER



At the time of this writing, we know that the counseling center ended the year in positive territory financially. Thank you for your time, talent and sharing of gifts. **The counseling center is excited to bring on board two pastoral counseling graduate students from Neumann University this spring.** Denise Reccardi, RN, BS, is a retired military nurse with Medevac and psychiatric nursing experience. She is interested in eventually working in the trauma counseling field. Paul Chmura brings a variety of life experiences including family caregiving across the life span. He is currently providing hospice counseling for families in the Berwyn, PA area. Highlighting the center's service in 2021, we saw 86

people, of those 22 people were couples. We provided 1108 counseling session hours. Eighteen people were new clients this past year.

We are continuing all counseling services virtually using doxy.me, a HIPAA and Hitech compliant program. If you know of anyone 18 years or older seeking pastoral counseling services, let us know.

The counseling center is honored to receive a G. F. Thomas grant 2022. This grant goes a long way in supporting the center's work. These funds directly support clients those who need the financial assistance. Last year, more than half of our scholarship funds came from this grant.


Thirty people were eligible for scholarship funds. Of those unable to pay the base rate, 469.5 sessions were provided. The difference in income from the base rate and what people were actually able to pay was \$15,547. Of this we were able to use the G.F. Thomas grant for 2021, funds from the United Way's Combined Charities Campaign, donations from the church and individuals in the community. A total of \$5535.00 was used from the scholarship fund. We are excited to add interns to our staff in 2022, which allows us to train new pastoral counselors and to enhance services in the community. Our interns bring a wealth of knowledge with them. Please refer people so that these talented folks can grow in pastoral counseling.
