## WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH?

I have had a few folks asking about what's going on in the denomination around ordination and officiating marriage of LGBTQIA+ persons. At the end of September our Bishop held a town hall about it (if you missed it, you can check it out in resources below). There was also just an article in the Frederick News Post in October, called "United Methodists are breaking up in a slow-motion schism." But you have heard me say very little about it, other than having a meeting back in the spring (which you can find on our Youtube page and in the resources below) and mentioning the bishop's town hall.

That's because nothing has changed.

The only body of the denomination that can speak for the denomination is General Conference- not the pastors, not the bishops, but the elected delegates (1/2 clergy and 1/2 laity) from Annual and Central Conferences around the world. They met in 2019 and, because of the pandemic, will not meet again in 2024.

Now, in 2019, General Conference \*did\* vote to become more restrictive on ordaining and officiating marriage of LGBTQIA+ persons. However, even though the General

Conference speaks for the denomination, we have a series of checks and balances based on the structure of the United States government. We have an executive branch (the Council of Bishops) and judicial branch (Judicial Council) in addition to the legislative (General Conference). The Judicial Council ruled much of what happened at General Conference as unconstitutional (I can give you specifics if you ask), and it was such an ugly experience (for instance, there was voting fraud- in the church!), that most bishops including our own have put a moratorium on prosecuting clergy over the ordination and officiating marriage of LGBTQIA+ persons.

So we spent all that money on General Conference- and all that angst and all that hope- and nothing really happened except everyone got more hurt and more frustrated. Some churches- both those who want to celebrate LGBTQIA+ persons fully in the life of the church and those who want to be more restrictive- decided that this debate is untenable and they want to disaffiliate from the denomination. If they didn't decide that immediately, they have continued to discern as it seems the next General Conference is too far away and too much trust has been lost that things will change.

In May, a caucus group within the denomination formed a

splinter denomination that would not welcome LGBTQIA+ persons in leadership or celebrate their marriages. That has made a little more noise for those who want to leave The United Methodist Church (called disaffiliating). However, you have not heard me talk about it because nothing has changed. Leaving this denomination for that one, even though it was formed by former United Methodists, is the same process as it would be for us to leave to become an independent congregational church or to join another denomination like the Episcopalians.

There is a huge financial burden to disaffiliating because we are in relationship with churches across the world, and we have a responsibility to care for retired clergy (you have to pay a certain amount into pensions to leave) and continue our mission and ministry (you have to pay a certain amount of mission shares to leave- which doesn't just pay for conference staff but also goes to organizations like UMCOR and Africa University and scholarships for college students). We also do not own our building (even though some of you remember paying for it) because our denomination has a trust clause, so we also owe the conference a percentage of what our property is worth. It is like a divorce. We are responsible to our denomination, even when we don't agree or don't get along. Churches might still decide to leave, and might need to for their own health and the health of the denomination, but it is not an easy process because we are responsible to the denomination that formed us.

Christians from the very beginning, as we see in Acts, didn't agree with one another on theological issues. Sometimes, like in the case of requiring circumcision or not, they holy conferenced until they came to a single decision to not require that Christians follow Jewish laws in Acts 15. But sometimes, theological differences like over whether or not to eat meat sacrificed to idols in 1 Corinthians 8 came down to individual community decisions based on what best helps people to love God. My prayer is that our denomination and our own congregation here at Trinity can be more like the Acts Church, seeking consensus and being conscious of how best to bring others to

Jesus, instead of our partisan U.S. Congress, unwilling to work together.

But if you are interested in disaffiliation, I will resource you and let you know the process, but I will not be involved myself. I know it has become increasingly difficult, but I minister best (not just pastor- but minister as we all do by virtue of our baptism) with people who don't agree with me, who will challenge me. I think we all minister better that way. I want to be in a church that feeds the hungry and lets people know Jesus loves them. I think we can still do that under the umbrella of The United Methodist Church, but if you disagree, I want you to be able to explore and understand for yourself.

People have been asking me what will happen in 2024, and I have no idea. I don't know if we will get to vote as a congregation on ordination and marriage as we thought we might do before General Conference 2019 actually happened. This is what I do know: we don't have to wait for the denomination or go through a process of disaffiliation to decide who we are. We never have had to. We can let go of all of this institutional anxiety and instead hold onto our purpose to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. It's what we do in Grow Time on Sunday mornings and our weekly men's, women's, and youth studies, diving deeper into Scripture and praying for one another. It's what we do with Operation Christmas Child and VBS, planting seeds of faith for God to give the growth. It's what we do serving the families in the Religious Coalition or on mission trips, putting our love in action. My prayer is no matter what happens or doesn't happen within the denomination that we keep holding onto that love and learning and serving.

I also see a lot of good in our denomination, even when I am frustrated by our Book of Discipline. I will write more on why I am a United Methodist for another newsletter, but this month I wanted to address disaffiliation and invite you to reach out anytime you want to talk more about what is happening in The United Methodist Church.

## 2022 HOLIDAY HOPE TREE

#### Participating in the Holiday Hope Tree program is easy:

- Select an ornament from the tree and complete the sign-up sheet located next to the tree.
- Purchase the gift, wrap it & tape the ornament to the outside of the gift.
- Place it under the tree in the Narthex NO LATER than Sunday, DEC. 4.

You can also help make this year a holiday of hope and joy for the residents by your participation at the Community Living Christmas Party here at Trinity on Sunday, December 11 where the gifts will be distributed.

#### **Charitable Giving**

In addition to the giving of a monetary gift, there are many ways you can support the ministries and missions of Trinity United Methodist Church. There are many opportunities for charitable giving. This list is just some examples for you and your family to consider.

- I. Gift of your time and talents: God has given each of us talents and the church often has a need for those skills. You can help the Church with your skills, such as plumbing, HVAC, electrical, gardening, fixing appliances or lawnmowers, painting, computers, lighting, sewing, etc. Let the Church know how you would like to help by putting a business card or note in the offering plate or calling/e-mailing the church office. Many ministry teams could benefit from your skills and talents.
- 2. <u>Gift of appreciated property</u>: Some of us have appreciated stock, bonds, real estate or collectibles. The property must have been owned at least one year. You get a charitable deduction for the average market value as of the date of the gift and you do not have to pay capital gains because you gifted the property rather than the cash.
- 3. Stock in a privately held company: Does your closely held company wish to buy back some of its stock? Your shares could be donated to the church and the company would buy the stock from the church. The church receives the proceeds of the sale and you avoid recognizing capital gains. You also get a charitable deduction based on the appraised value of the stock.
- 4. <u>Sale of depreciated stock:</u> Do you have a stock that has gone down in value and it doesn't look like it will be going up anytime soon? Consider selling the stock and give the proceeds as a monetary gift. Not only will you get the charitable deduction, you will also be able to claim a loss on your tax return, subject to limitations.
- 5. <u>Life Insurance:</u> An easy and direct form of planned giving is through a new life insurance policy. You make Trinity the beneficiary and owner of the policy. The premiums are tax-deductible and policies can be paid up within a few years. Do you have an existing life insurance policy? If you transfer the ownership of the policy to the church and make the church the beneficiary, you will receive a charitable deduction in the amount of the cash surrender value at the time of transfer. Any additional premiums paid would be tax deductible.
- 6. <u>Charitable Remainder Trust or Charitable Gift Annuity:</u> Do you have investments but you need an income stream from the dividends or interest to pay your bills? You can set up a charitable remainder trust or a charitable gift annuity. The trust or annuity will pay you until your death with the remainder going to the church after death.
- 7. <u>Charitable lead Trusts:</u> Do you have investments and desire to leave your estate to your heirs? There are charitable lead trusts that can be set up where the first 15 20 years the annual payments go to the church, and, afterwards, the remaining funds revert to your heirs.
- 8. <u>Your Will:</u> Do you have investments but you want to make sure you have enough to take care of you through your retirement years? Consider including the church in the provisions of your will.

As Jesus said "Freely you have received; freely give" (Matthew 10:8)
