I have a lot of questions for Jesus. I imagine some of you do too! The problem with Jesus is, he has a lot of questions for us. One count I saw recently pointed out, "In the Gospels, Jesus is asked 187 ques-

tions. He answers (maybe) 8 of them. He himself asks 307."

At the end of February, Lent began. Lent is a time when we seek to draw closer to God. Often we do this by taking up a new spiritual discipline, or fasting from the things that get in the way of our relationship with God. This year in worship, we are using questions to guide us. We will be following A Sanctified Art's Lenten series called "Seeking: Honest Questions for Deeper Faith." We'll be asking questions with characters from Matthew and John's gospels, from the Israelites roaming in the wilderness, from the prophets. Some of those questions might be the same ones we have ourselves. Some of those questions won't necessarily be answered, but maybe they will help us draw nearer to God.

The creators of this series explain:

"Like the characters in our Lenten scriptures, we are also seeking many things: clarity, connection, wonder, justice, balance. We are seeking our calling, the sacred, and how to live as a disciple. Throughout the turbulence of the past few years, many of us are asking big questions about our lives and our faith. If you are returning to church, you are probably returning with more questions and a critical lens. We hope this series will help us unpack some of those big questions in ways that are honest and faithful. Throughout this season, we hope you will continually ask yourself: what am I seeking? What is God seeking? This Lent, we invite you to engage in the spiritual practice of seeking. ...continued on page 2



We encourage you to stay curious, open, and nimble. We hope you will soften your assumptions and expand your perspectives. We pray that these questions will create a safe space to explore—to be drawn more deeply into the fullness of life, into the heart of God."

So think about what questions you have for God. Bring those questions to worship. Bring them to study (with scheduling, we did not try an all-church study this year, but we still have Grow Time on Sundays, and men's study and women's study during the week). Bring them with you in prayer. And don't seek answers. Seek to be honest with God. And seek to listen to the questions God is asking you.

THE FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

seeking: Who will you listen to?

Matthew 4:1-11 | Genesis 2:15-17, 3:1-7

Seeking the fruit of the garden, Adam and Eve allow the snake's manipulative voice to become louder than God's voice. In the wilderness, Jesus defies the deception of the tempter by listening intuitively—to God, to his inner moral compass, to the teachings of his faith. And so, who will you listen to? What sources do you seek for news, information, and media? Whose voices—and what messages—take up too much space in your head? Within the onslaught of messaging we



THE SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT

seeking: How do we begin again?

John 3:1-17 | Genesis 12:1-4a

Nicodemus comes to Jesus under the veil of night to ask him big faith questions. Jesus invites him to begin again, to learn a new way of knowing and living out his faith. In Genesis, God commands Abram and Sarai to leave everything—their home, their family, their land—to seek the land of Canaan and begin again. Like Nicodemus, what are the questions we ask in the dark? Like Abram and Sarai, how do we follow God's calling to begin again?



THE THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

seeking: Will you give me a drink?

Exodus 17:1-7

In the wilderness, the Israelites essentially ask: "Will you give us a drink, God? Will you take care of us, even now?" This week, we might imagine ourselves in the wilderness. Are we willing to care for our neighbors, seeking to not just quench thirst, but to find living waters that sustain us all?



THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT

seeking: Who sinned?

John 9:1-7 | John 9:8-41

When Jesus and the disciples encounter a blind man along the way, the disciples immediately ask, "Teacher, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" (John 9:2). They ask a really bad question, filled with assumptions and harmful theology. Unfortunately, the crowd continues to interrogate the man and dissect the miracle of his healing. This week, let us pay attention to the questions we ask. What assumptions do we carry? What is our intent? When seeking clarity or understanding, what are better questions we can ask?

5 TIPS

INDOOR SPRING PLANT CARE

CHECKING THE ROOTS

Slide your plant gently out of its pot. It asks for repotting when you see:

- more roots than soil
- winding roots
- \bullet roots are growing along the topsoil
- · roots are creeping out the drainage holes

LIGHTING

Longer days mean several things for your indoor plants:

- longer stretches of sunlit through the day
- the change of direct sunlight pattern flooding through the window

Adjust their placement at different points throughout the day, ensuring they get the ideal amount of light.

WATERING

Growing plants use up water more quickly. It means you have to do frequent watering.

- make sure to water deeply and thoroughly, letting the liquid soak into the soil
- pick pots with drainage holes to avoid overwatering
- ensure to remove the excess water collected in the saucer to prevent root rot

SEASONAL CLEANING

Your plants need a fresh start for spring. Put the plants aside for a few hours. Deal with the debris, dust, or other mess piled on or over during the past winter.

- remove dead leaves and trim away yellow or brown leaves
- check carefully for any sign of disease or pest
- · wipe the leaves with a wet cloth or dusting gloves

NURTURING

Once you notice new growth, it is time for fertilizing.

- you can try to apply a balanced, water-soluble indoor plant fertilizer
- carefully follow the instructions
