My favorite season is the fall- I don't look forward to the hot weather of spring and summer, but coming out of even a mild winter, like this one has been, still always seems magical. Springtime is a little resurrection in the world every year. Seeing trees flowering alongside highways and daffodils in bloom everywhere is a powerful statement on starting over. Having a baby in the spring, especially a few months after my grandfather passed and after such a long and fraught time of infertility and loss, seems a beautiful way to start over as well.

But spring, new babies, even resurrection- these are not undo buttons: if a tree falls in the winter, it doesn't pop back up when it is time to bloom. Mary Magdalene, when she saw Jesus and realized he was alive, was ecstatic, but even that joy did not undo the trauma she had at witnessing his horrible death. When Jesus appeared to Thomas, he showed him that the wounds were still there--- yes, he was alive, but he was still marked by his experience on the cross. Deaths like literal deaths or more figurative kinds of loss shape us, change us, and that transformation doesn't just go away after resurrection. We are so excited for our new baby, but that does not make me miss Autumn any less. We still have not set up the nursery! Resurrection is not about going back to life the way it was before the worst happened.

Instead, resurrection is the opportunity for a radical new life after the worst. Like when a person gets a divorce and mourns the change in life and loss of relationship but is also now able to live a fuller life out of what may have been a controlling or toxic marriage. That person is marked by that relationship but still able to build something new going forward. God is present in that building of something new. Or think about a person in recovery for addiction. Addiction has permanently changed their brain, but recovery is about a radical new life, a healthier one than the one they had even before struggling with addiction. Resurrection life can happen now, if we make a choice to listen for Jesus' voice calling for us even when we feel stuck in places of death.

On April 9, we will celebrate Easter on one big blowout day with flowers and the choir and the brass and Alleluias, but Easter is really a season in the church year, a fifty day long season. As such, it is a good time to think about the resurrections all around us. The promise of resurrection is not just a promise for Jesus. It is not just a promise for us when we die.

It is a promise that, to use Frederick Buechner's famous words, "the worst thing is never the last thing." We can have resurrection in our lives here and now. This Easter season, may it be so for you and for me! We encourage you to stay curious, open, and nimble.

We hope you will soften your assumptions and expand your perspectives. We pray that these questions will create a safe space to explore—to be drawn more deeply into the fullness of life, into the heart of God."

So think about what questions you have for God. Bring those questions to worship. Bring them to study (with scheduling, we did not try an all-church study this year, but we still have Grow Time on Sundays, and men's study and women's study during the week). Bring them with you in prayer. And don't seek answers. Seek to be honest with God. And seek to listen to the questions God is asking you.

PALM / PASSION SUNDAY

seeking: Where are you headed?

Matthew 21:1-11

Imagine you are in Jerusalem when Jesus enters on a donkey. Within the chaos and commotion of that scene, where are you and which way will you go? Will you follow Jesus all the way to the cross? Jesus' willing surrender to his arrest should always catch us off-guard. As dismayed as the disciples, we ask, "Jesus, are you really headed this way, straight to your death?" Many of our weekly questions throughout the season so far have helped us prepare spiritually for Holy Week. Now we examine if our beliefs have changed our behaviors. Has your path changed? In the midst of opposing forces, which way will you go?



MAUNDY THURSDAY

seeking: Will you wash my feet?

John 13:1-17, 31b-35

In his final night with his friends and followers, Jesus shows the fullness of his love by removing his robe, kneeling, and washing the disciples' feet. As he makes his way around the room, Jesus comes to Simon Peter who protests, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Like Peter, we may also question if God loves us and will care for us, even at the brink of death. In these final hours of accompanying Jesus to his grave, can we seek a posture of trust? Can we allow ourselves to be embraced and loved—by our neighbor and by God?



GOOD FRIDAY

seeking: Why have you forsaken me?

Matthew 27:27-50

Of all the questions in our series, this one remains the most unanswerable. Jesus' final lament gives voice to all those who have been forsaken—those who suffer injustice, those who are abandoned, those who are unjustly convicted. Instead of trying to answer this question with logic or theology, we are invited to live it, to sit with it. Sitting with this unsettling question unearths and unveils many more questions: What do we do in the face of unimaginable suffering? Can we sit in the silence of death and trust that God is there? Will we be in solidarity with those who suffer and grieve?



EASTER SUNDAY

seeking: Who are you looking for?

John 20:1-18

Jesus, mysteriously appearing to Mary as the gardener, asks her: "Why are you weeping? Who are you looking for?" In the haze of grief, Mary can only see what is right before her—or in this case, what is not before her. It is only when Jesus calls her by name that the veil is lifted and she beholds the resurrected Christ. On this Easter morning, who—or what—are you looking for? Why have you come to the tomb? What kind of Jesus are you looking for? What veils need to be lifted so we can recognize God's resurrection wherever it occurs?



This is the month! Our baby is due April 26! We are planning for this baby to come a little earlier than that, so please keep us in prayer as we schedule a c-section and keep watch for early labor. So because the baby will be here soon, I wanted to share my maternity leave plans.

Pastor John is on-call for me during leave. He will be preaching for me, as will a few other retired clergy including Jim Spiller, David Coakley, and Kathy Kohl. We will also celebrate our high school seniors with a Youth Group-led service, and we'll have a music-themed service in there too! If you have any questions or concerns, please call Pastor John or reach out to the office.

I will be taking about 9 weeks off after the baby is born (depends on how early the baby comes!). I am grateful that The United Methodist Church in general and Trinity in particular is supportive of new parents in this way. We get 8 weeks paid leave by the Book of Discipline, and then I have vacation time- though I want to be back in time for Vacation Bible School because I love it!


Maternity leave for me will not mean no contact whatsoever, but it will mean you shouldn't expect to see me on Sundays, I won't be leading programs or officiating funerals or weddings, and I won't be answering email. Instead, Aaron, Zekie, and I will be juggling our new responsibilities and spending time with our extended families.

I will want to introduce you to the baby as soon as possible, but please remember that even though flu season is over, there are plenty of other germs flying about (thanks COVID), we want to be smart about bringing the baby out in public. There will be pictures shared to tide you over though! We will have a welcome party for the baby after worship on my first Sunday back, which I plan on being Sunday June 25.

Your prayers have been such a blessing to our family, as this whole pregnancy has been so scary given our last pregnancy. Even people who are in the hospital have shared prayers for me when I visit intending to pray for them! I am hopeful to celebrate new life with you soon!



Children's Ministry Update

We will be having Children's Church on the first Sunday of each month (except April, when we will be hosting the Easter Egg Hunt after

worship on April 2). This will mean the order of worship on the first Sunday will be a bit different to give kids more time to explore the stories and still come back for communion. We welcome kids to stay in worship the whole time if families are more comfortable, but this is an option too!

The nursery is also open but unstaffed. Families are welcome to use the nursery at any time throughout the service if they need to stretch their legs, and they are welcome to borrow toys from the nursery and use them in the sanctuary during the service (the quieter ones please). On the Sundays we have two unrelated, backgroundchecked volunteers, grown-ups may leave their kids in the nursery with the volunteers; otherwise please stay in the nursery with your child! We welcome fidgety and talkative kids (and grownups!) in worship, but we know sometimes families want other options as well.
