

Advent "All Earth is Waiting" November 26-December 17

This year, we are schooching Advent up a week to stretch it out and give Christmas Eve a full day (instead of just the evening). That means it begins for us in November. This is the beginning of our Christian liturgical year- and a time of waiting. Where have we heard and experienced God's good news in the past? And how are we opening our hearts to experience- and our hands to share- that good news now?

The series we'll be following is one by a United Methodist young clergywoman and it's focus is creation. After a year in which wildfires gave us apocalyptic skies and air quality days so bad we were stuck indoors, is there good news for God's creation in this new year? Rev. Katie Z. Dawson reminds us that God's good news is for the whole world- not just for the afterlife. And that good news brings with it responsibility.

You can find the book used pretty cheap if you want to follow along on your own or in Grow Time on Sundays before worship. Here is Rev. Dawson's challenge and blessing for us this Advent:



"This Advent, let us stop and listen to heaven and nature sing. Let us explore what we have in common with this earth. And let us discover what it might mean to share the good news with this planet. Our salvation is intimately connected with the redemption of this world, so may we find ways to live lives worthy of God's kingdom."

Charitable Giving


In addition to the giving of a monetary gift, there are many ways you can support the ministries and missions of Trinity United Methodist Church. There are many opportunities for charitable giving. This list is just some examples for you and your family to consider.

- I. <u>Gift of your time and talents:</u> God has given each of us talents and the church often has a need for those skills. You can help the Church with your skills, such as plumbing, HVAC, electrical, gardening, fixing appliances or lawnmowers, painting, computers, lighting, sewing, etc. Let the Church know how you would like to help by putting a business card or note in the offering plate or calling/e-mailing the church office. Many ministry teams could benefit from your skills and talents.
- 2. <u>Gift of appreciated property</u>: Some of us have appreciated stock, bonds, real estate or collectibles. The property must have been owned at least one year. You get a charitable deduction for the average market value as of the date of the gift and you do not have to pay capital gains because you gifted the property rather than the cash.
- 3. Stock in a privately held company: Does your closely held company wish to buy back some of its stock? Your shares could be donated to the church and the company would buy the stock from the church. The church receives the proceeds of the sale and you avoid recognizing capital gains. You also get a charitable deduction based on the appraised value of the stock.
- 4. <u>Sale of depreciated stock:</u> Do you have a stock that has gone down in value and it doesn't look like it will be going up anytime soon? Consider selling the stock and give the proceeds as a monetary gift. Not only will you get the charitable deduction, you will also be able to claim a loss on your tax return, subject to limitations.
- 5. <u>Life Insurance:</u> An easy and direct form of planned giving is through a new life insurance policy. You make Trinity the beneficiary and owner of the policy. The premiums are tax-deductible and policies can be paid up within a few years. Do you have an existing life insurance policy? If you transfer the ownership of the policy to the church and make the church the beneficiary, you will receive a charitable deduction in the amount of the cash surrender value at the time of transfer. Any additional premiums paid would be tax deductible.
- 6. <u>Charitable Remainder Trust or Charitable Gift Annuity:</u> Do you have investments but you or a family member need an income stream from the dividends or interest to pay your bills? You can set up a charitable remainder trust or a charitable gift annuity. The trust or annuity will pay you until your or your family member's death with the remainder going to the church after death.
- 7. <u>Charitable lead Trusts:</u> Do you have investments and desire to leave your estate to your heirs? There are charitable lead trusts that can be set up where the first 15 20 years the annual payments go to the church, and, afterwards, the remaining funds revert to your heirs.
- 8. <u>Your Will:</u> Do you have investments but you want to make sure you have enough to take care of you through your retirement years? Consider including the church in the provisions of your will.

As Jesus said "Freely you have received; freely give" (Matthew 10:8)

2023 HOLIDAY HOPE TREE


