

Happy Easter! Now that we've celebrated the resurrection, let us talk about what brings everyone life: institutional organizational structures! Whoop whoop!

Ok, I am being silly, and I hope you spend time reading the resurrection stories in the Gospels and also some of the Acts of the Apostles this season, but this month I wanted to share about structure for a couple reasons:

- 1. The General Conference of The United Methodist Church, the only body of the church that speaks for the church, meets in Charlotte, North Carolina from April 23 to May 3. Our Trinity Brass will be playing during opening worship on April 23, so we will have a watch party as well as other opportunities for prayer for our denomination throughout those weeks.
- 2. Our church leadership has been looking at our own structure for going on two years now and considering making changes to streamline decision-making and free people up for mission and ministry. Structure might not be the Good News. In fact is definitely is not the Good News! It might not be interesting or exciting. But structure can help or hinder us to make disciples, and so in this newsletter I wanted to be real with you about both our denominational structure that too often leaves us a mess and our local church structure and how we can make changes.



The above is one of the various charts that might help visualize what the heck all this conferencing we United Methodists talk about is. I'm happy to talk about this structure with anyone interested, but I wanted to focus this first part on General Conference. This is the only body of the denomination that can speak for the denomination is General Conference- not the pastors, not the bishops, but the elected delegates (1/2 clergy and 1/2 laity) from Annual and Central Conferences around the world. They met in 2019 and, because of the pandemic, will not meet again until NOW.

I have led a few evening talks about what is going on in our denomination. You may have seen articles in the paper




Hi all! We wanted to get this baby baptized for a while now, but juggling family schedules and auntie pastor schedules has been difficult.

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about it: the church has been in an ugly fight over ordination and marriage of LGBTQIA+ people in the church for decades, but in the last few General Conferences the fight has become completely unbearable. For example, our polity actually restricts people in same-sex relationships from being ordained or getting married in our churches, but, mostly because of how ugly the fight has been, most Annual Conferences, including ours the Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference, are ignoring the restrictive polity or have a moratorium on "defrocking" pastors in same-sex marriages or pastors who officiate same-sex weddings.

We have no idea what will happen as a result of this upcoming conference. There is legislation about more than ordination and marriage to be discussed- there are budgets and a new potential regional structure that are important, as well as many other things, but we just don't know what will happen in the two weeks of conferencing. I am always available to talk with you more about church history, structure, and polity because I am a giant nerd like that-I am having trouble keeping this newsletter short! You can also check our resources below. I share this with you to ask you to be in prayer.

Pray about, and imagine, what ways could we structure to better enable us as a denomination to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world? What could we do as a denomination to share a message of grace together?

Our own Trinity Brass will be playing during opening worship in Charlotte, North Carolina, and we will have a watch party and share the link for those of you who want to watch. We will have the labyrinth set up for prayer, and I'll have something following General Conference to let you know what happened.


Secondly, Trinity UMC and a potential Simplified Board Structure...

If you are an avid reader of the Cloverleaf, then you have read about General Conference and a One Board or Simplified Board Structure before. But want to be transparent and try to phrase things in new ways to help people understand! Our Church Council has met with two churches and will meet with a third as we explore moving to cut some of our committees and centralize decision-making. This new administrative structure, known as the Simplified Accountable structure, or the One Board Model.

This model moves churches from four administrative committees (trustees, finance, staff-parish relations, and church council) to one Leadership Board encapsulating all responsibilities and authority of the previous four separate administrative committees. This "Committee of Stewards" would only meet once a month, freeing up people from meetings. Church leadership experts recommend a total of 9-15 people make up the new board, and they recommend these folks serve in 3 year classes. The board is NOT self-nominating- a nominations committee still does that work. And ministry teams like the Altar Guild, Missions, and the hands-on building care part of trustees continue to exist independently. Work groups such as a budgeting group might be formed for short term projects.

There are three major benefits in my view:

- 1. There is literally no day of the week for us to have an evening Bible study that wouldn't either interfere with choir or a meeting once a month. When we did Disciple FastTrack last year, we would have Disciple from 6:30-8 and then one day a month Church Council would be from 8 until 9 or 9:30. That is not a sustainable schedule! And churches need to have at least one evening a week free for Bible study!
- 2. There are several of us on multiple committees, and we often have the same meeting over and over and over as Trustees minutes are shared at Finance, and Finance at Trustees and SPRC, and all of them are shared again at church council.



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3. We need to be able to make decisions more quickly. While we do vote over email on occasion, we sometimes have situations like the hiring of a bookkeeper, for instance, in which finance has to approve candidates, SPRC has to have input, if it's a contract rather than a direct hire the Trustees have to sign it, and if it is a contract over a certain amount it must be approved in Church Council.

Structure can be a tool we use to help us deepen our own discipleship. It can help us make disciples as well! Or it can hinder us. Let us be in prayer for our own church and for our denomination that our institutions can help us live into our calling to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world!

Please know that we have not made a decision yet and that congregational approval, in the form of a Charge Conference, is needed to make any changes to our church structure. Reach out and ask questions!
